**Seventh Sunday
of Easter**



The conclusion of the easter season draws near: the great solemnity of Pentecost. This Seventh Sunday of Easter is an in-between feast, which looks back to the Ascension and anticipates the coming gift of the Holy Spirit.

LECTIONARY

FIRST READING: Today's reading from Acts of the Apostles is sandwiched (like this Seventh Sunday of Easter) between the account of the Ascension and the account of Pentecost. Peter speaks to the followers of Jesus--we are told it is quite a large group, about one hundred and twenty people--and calls for the selection of a new apostle to take the place of Judas. We get an insight into the special role of an apostle, who must be someone who has been with them from the beginning, "the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us" (Acts 1:21), from his Baptism until his Ascension. The manner in which the new apostle is chosen is illuminating. The entire group, not just the Eleven, present two candidates. Asking for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the final decision is made by the drawing of lots. Matthias is chosen.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 103 looks to God, who dwells in the heavens, but who rules over all with forgiving love.

SECOND READING: We see the intertwining of ideas characteristic of St. John. "No one has ever seen God" (1John 4:12), yet when we love each other, God is in us. The more we love each other, the more we will come to "know" God's love for us (4:13). In our love for others, we will truly see God.

GOSPEL: The Gospel is drawn from what is called the "high priestly prayer" of Jesus at the conclusion of the Last Supper discourses in the Gospel according to John. Immediately before his arrest, Jesus prays for his disciples. He prays "that they may be one just as we are one" (John 17:11). He does not pray that their lives will be easy--indeed, it is clear that they will face the same trials Jesus himself faced. They will be hated by a world in which they cannot feel at home, for "they do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world" (17:14). They are sent forth nevertheless, not only witnesses to Jesus, but sharers in his love, his joy, and his peace.

Pentecost Celebration

Pentecost is the final day of Easter. Christians adopted the feast from the Jewish harvest festival of *Shavuot*, which is a memorial of the day God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses. For Christians, Pentecost is the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples as wind and fire. It is the moment in which Jesus fulfilled his promise to send his Spirit to his followers (Jn 14:16).

Jesus said he'd send an advocate, a helper. There are unlimited ways in which we are helped by the Spirit. Scripture lists seven gifts in particular that the Spirit gives us: wisdom, understanding, courage, knowledge, right judgment, reverence, and awe (Is 11:1-3).

Anytime we need help, we can ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with one of these gifts (or any other gift we need). We will experience the very same power that the disciples did on that first Pentecost. It probably won't be as dramatic, but it will be just as real.

To celebrate, plan a banquet-style dinner on the same scale as your dinner on the first Sunday of Easter. Either at the beginning of the day or just before dinner, offer this prayer to the Holy Spirit:

Come, Holy Spirit, fill our hearts and kindle in us the fire of your love. Restore the glory of Creation and renew the face of the earth.
