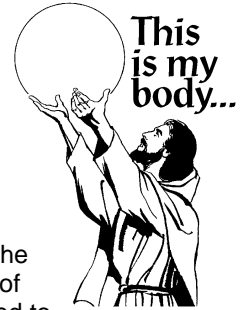

**The Most Holy  
Body & Blood  
of Christ**



Measured by Church time, today's solemnity is quite young dating from the mid-thirteenth-century. For hundreds of years, in fact, it was commonly referred to as *nova sollemnitatis*, "the new solemnity" (The Liturgy and Time, 104). This celebration has been given many names over the centuries: feast of the Eucharist, feast of the Most Precious Sacrament, even feast of God. In France it is still commonly known as the *Fête-Dieu*. The solemnity developed at about the same time as the elevations of the consecrated elements during Mass, and it arose out of the desire of the faithful to see the Blessed Sacrament at a time when they did not often receive it.

The solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is an expression of our Catholic faith in the real presence of the risen Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, this celebration is also outward-looking, carrying the liturgy out of the Church and into the streets.

**THE FIRST READING:** Moses has given the people the entire law, and the people respond "with one voice" (Exodus 24:3), promising to observe this law which God has given them. The blood of the bull becomes the sign of the covenant into which the people enter of their own free will.

**THE RESPONSORIAL** that follows is the same psalm we sang on Holy Thursday. To take up "the cup of salvation" (116:13) is a way to give thanks to God for all his benefits.

**THE SECOND READING** is deeply rooted in the first. The author of the letter to the Hebrews expects his reader to be familiar with Jewish rites and practices. He draws especially on the rites for the Day of Atonement, the holiest day on the Jewish calendar, the day for repentance and forgiveness of transgressions against the law. The old covenant becomes a metaphor for the new, as Jesus enacts on a spiritual level what the priest does on a material one. Jesus is the high priest who offers his own blood, and passes not into a tabernacle built by hands, but into heaven itself. For those who receive the blood of Christ, the result is not a cleansing of the flesh, but of the spirit, the conscience.

**THE GOSPEL** carries us back to Holy Week. Jesus and his disciples are celebrating the Passover together. In the context of the ancient Jewish holy day, Jesus gives himself to his disciples. How astonished they must have been at his words as he handed them the bread: "this is my body" (Mark 14:22), and the cup: "this is my blood of the covenant" (14:24). It would not be until after the Resurrection that they would begin to understand what it all meant. It's reassuring to remember that Jesus invites us to this banquet because he loves us..

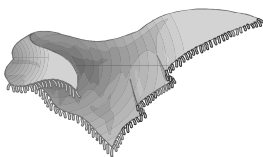
## Wellness Ministry Cares... Assistance Program
