32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



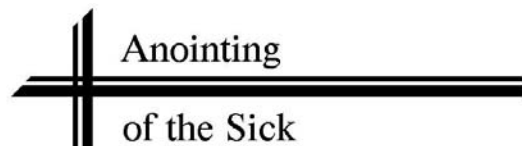
In today's readings, two generous widows give us an insight into how God views our giving. We are to give in the spirit of the Lord's Prayer, in which we ask not for tomorrow's bread, but for today's. These widows show us how to trust in God to provide for tomorrow.

THE FIRST READING In the passage from 1 Kings, Elijah begs a widow for a drink of water, and then for some bread. The prophet could go to the wealthy people in Zarephath, but he asks this poor widow for help instead. In spite of her great need, she gives Elijah what she has, and believes his seemingly impossible promise: that the God of Israel will make her handful of flour and her last little bit of oil last until the rain returns. Of the little she has, God makes enough.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM 146 responds to the First Reading, recalling God's special care for the poor, especially "the fatherless and the widow" (146:9).

GOSPEL: The longer form includes a passage in which Jesus condemns the scribes, who "devour the houses of widows" (Mark 12:40) by exacting contributions from them and demand special treatment wherever they go. A "severe condemnation" awaits these unjust dealings (12:40). Both the longer form and the shorter form include the familiar story of the "widow's mite." Jesus watches the people putting money into the treasury. Rich people come by and put in huge sums; then a widow comes by and puts in two small coins, worth almost nothing. Jesus is probably the only one who even notices her gift. He tells his disciples that she had put in more than any of the others. This statement must have stunned them. God measures our giving not by how much we give, but by *how* we give. The others only gave what they could easily spare. She, like the widow who provided for Elijah, gave—in faith—what she could not spare, "her whole livelihood" (12:44).

SECOND READING: The ongoing reading from the Hebrews continues to parallel Jesus, the high priest, and the priests of Jewish ritual. The writer describes the rituals of the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur), when the high priest offers sacrifice to free the people of their sins. This sacrifice, offered in a manmade sanctuary, with "blood that is not his own" (Hebrews 9:25), must be repeated year after year. But the sacrifice of Christ, who entered into heaven itself with the offering of his own blood, supersedes all other sacrifices. This sacrifice is offered just once. Christ's Second Coming is not like his first: when he comes again, it will not be to take away sin, but to "bring salvation" (9:28).

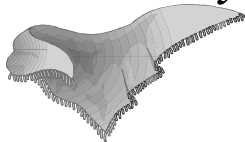

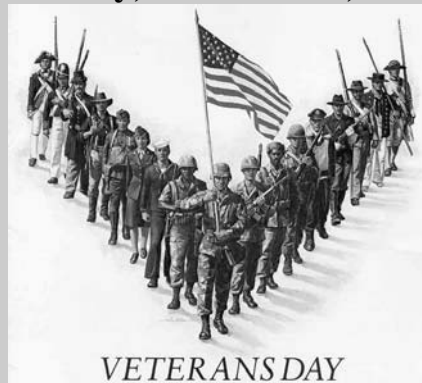
