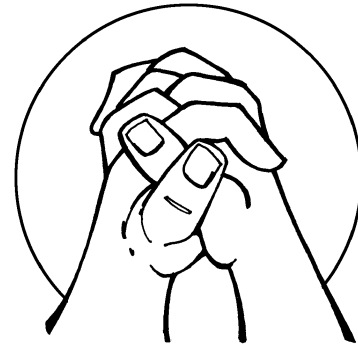

that are above.**

Col 3:1

The tone of the readings is set by the verse for Ecclesiastes, "Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" (1:2). Jesus disparages greed and materialism in his parable of the rich man. In modern parlance we would say, "You can't take it with you."

FIRST READING:

Qoheleth proclaims human existence pointless, void of meaning or purpose. In so doing he strikes a deep cord in the experience of many, creating a home in God's word for those who struggle with these same thoughts and questions. Human emotion embraced in faith, especially the deep yearning of the heart, leads to fuller life.

RESPONSORIAL:

In Psalm 90 the Church prays for the grace to be fully open to hear and respond to God's voice. We are invited to repent of our past "Meribah" and "Massah" moments.

SECOND READING:

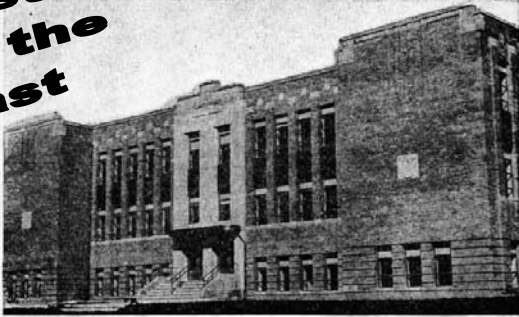
Paul exhorts the Colossians to embrace the full meaning and purpose of their life in Christ. Since Christ orients them to eternal life, their daily lives ought to be transformed by this transcendent goal. This transcendent goal grants a new perspective to our relationship with our own bodies and to everybody. Thus, we receive the call to purity and to put an end to barriers of religion, social status, and gender.

GOSPEL:

Jesus echoes Qoheleth's sentiment concerning the futility of earthly existence without a transcendent horizon. The erection of storage bins to secure a merely earthly future is futile for death's arrival, though unpredictable in time, is inevitable. On the other hand, the building of a storehouse of heavenly treasure through good deeds engaged in for love of God and neighbor will reap a harvest of an eternal reward.

SAINT THOMAS THE APOSTLE HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL

Written in 1942

Saint Thomas the Apostle School opened on September ninth, 1940, with an enrollment of 376 pupils, and a teaching staff of eight Sisters of Charity and one lay teacher. Nine of the twelve ideal class rooms were utilized by the kindergarten and regular grades.

Saturday, October fifth, 1940, the Convent of Saint Thomas the Apostle was dedicated. The children of the school paid tribute to Archbishop Walsh. They were represented by Jane Regan, an eighth grade student, who delivered an address and they in turn sang, "God Bless America" and "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name".

Shortly after the opening of school, we organized a choir which consisted of pupils of the seventh and eighth grades, and at the same time a chancel choir representing our fifth and sixth grade boys. Under the direction of William P. Stanley, these two groups rendered their first accomplishment in the singing of the Gregorian Mass of the Missa Brevis at the "Forty Hours Devotion," in Nov., 1940.

The societies of the Junior Children of Mary, Junior Holy Name, Sacred Heart, Angels and the Girls and Boy Scouts have been organized and are functioning admirably. On May twenty-first two hundred children were confirmed by Bishop Boland. On May twenty-fifth there was a solemn May procession in pageant form to our blessed Lady. The children represented the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary. The crowning of our Lady was done by one of the kindergarten pupils.

Our first graduation of twenty-three pupils took place on Sunday evening, June twenty-second. On that morning the graduates enjoyed a Communion breakfast in the cafeteria as guests of the parish priests.

September eighth, 1941, school opened with an enrollment of 438 pupils. The enrollment is now 470. We now have in the grades a faculty of eight Sisters, and two lay teachers. We also have two special teachers, one for Physical Education and the other for Vocal Training.

May nineteenth will be our first Kindergarten Graduation which will be followed by a Physical Education and Entertainment given by the pupils of the Primary and Grammar departments.

Our second graduation of forty-three pupils will take place on Sunday, June twenty-first. This great progress in our infant school is a clear manifestation of perfect cooperation of our good pastor, Father Herron, his worthy assistants, parents, pupils, and teaching staff.

All working as a living unit for God and country have helped to attain the great progress made by the school in her religious and social activities.

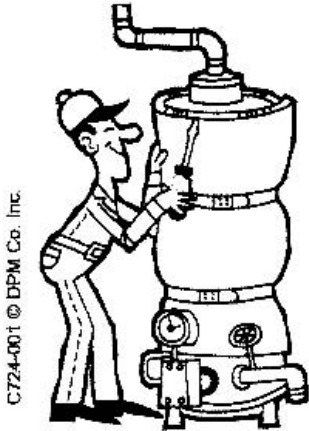
STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE

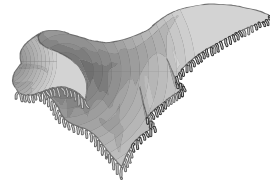
Wellness Ministry Cares... Assistance Program
