As the last weeks of summer vacation approach, teachers if not students, are beginning to prepare their return to school. Let your lamps be burning ready, Jesus tells us. Be ready! Be Prepared!

FIRST READING:

The book of Wisdom suggests that God's deliverance of his people from the snares of darkness, as in the Passover and Exodus, are expected in the lives of believers in every generation. God's merciful listening to our cry for deliverance and his powerful intervention on our behalf set us free.

RESPONSORIAL:

In Psalm 33 the Church exhorts us to keep our eyes fixed on the Lord, whose kindness leads us to trust in his promise to deliver us from the lands of our enemies.

SECOND READING:

The letter to the Hebrews tells us that faith is marked by confidence and conviction in God's desire and power to save. As Abraham and Sarah trusted in God's benevolence, believers in every age are called to place their trust, not in their own power to believe, but in the benevolence of God who invites us to faith. Just as Abraham and Sarah's faith produced numerous offspring, so the faith of every believer bears great fruit.

GOSPEL:

Jesus invites the disciples to live without fear and to trust in God's benevolence in calling them to the kingdom. Yet, he suggests that living without fear is not the same as living without passions for God and for his kingdom. In a sense, we are called to fear all that is not of God, those "realities" that lead us into darkness. On the other hand, we are called to embrace with passion God's desire for our lives.

OF MARY***

***Sunday, August 15
A Holy day***

The Solemnity of the Assumption celebrates Mary's entrance into heaven, body and soul. Mary is the first among the faithful to be fully redeemed because of her perpetually sinless state. Mary, because of her relationship to her Son, shares, through privileged anticipation, in the grace of the resurrection of the dead. Mary does not have to endure the suspension of eternal life until the resurrection of the dead.

The assumption of Mary was declared a dogma of faith to be believed by faithful Catholics, by Pope Pius XII on Nov. 1, 1950. The Solemnity is a holy day but *not* a holy day of obligation.

8 Lifestyle changes to prevent Alzheimer's disease

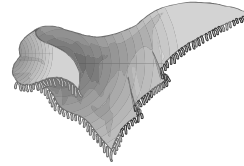
1. Eat more fruits and vegetables.
