Advent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Duration: 4 weeks Celebrating Jesus' birth and we anticipate His Second Coming It starts the Liturgical Year
Christmas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Duration: 2-3 weeks Celebrating Jesus' birth, the Holy Family, the Epiphany and His Baptism We celebrate God being with us, salvation to all, and giving gifts.
Ordinary Time	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Duration: 33-34 weeks Celebrating Jesus' parables, miracles and teachings. It is in two parts
Lent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Duration: 40 days, not including Sundays Celebrating Jesus' fasting for 40 days that begins His Ministry and His Journey to Jerusalem that end with the Paschal Mystery. It is a time for us to reflection on our lives and things we need to change.
Triduum	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Duration: 3 days Celebrating the Last Supper, Jesus' arrest, trial, crucifixion and burial. It is a time of quiet reflection on the Sacrifice Jesus made for us.
Easter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Duration: 50 Days, From the Easter Vigil to Pentecost Celebrating the Resurrection and Him defeating Sin, Death and the Devil. It is a time of Joyful Celebration and a time to become aware of our Baptism and Baptismal vows that save us from Death and Sin.
