Advent	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Duration: 4 weeks• Celebrating Jesus' birth and we anticipate His Second Coming• It starts the Liturgical Year
Christmas	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Duration: 2-3 weeks• Celebrating Jesus' birth, the Holy Family, the Epiphany and His Baptism• We celebrate God being with us, salvation to all, and giving gifts.
Ordinary Time	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Duration: 33-34 weeks• Celebrating Jesus' parables, miracles and teachings.• It is in two parts
Lent	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Duration: 40 days, not including Sundays• Celebrating Jesus' fasting for 40 days that begins His Ministry and His Journey to Jerusalem that end with the Paschal Mystery.• It is a time for us to reflection on our lives and things we need to change.
Triduum	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Duration: 3 days• Celebrating the Last Supper, Jesus' arrest, trial, crucifixion and burial.• It is a time of quiet reflection on the Sacrifice Jesus made for us.
Easter	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Duration: 50 Days, From the Easter Vigil to Pentecost• Celebrating the Resurrection and Him defeating Sin, Death and the Devil.• It is a time of Joyful Celebration and a time to become aware of our Baptism and Baptismal vows that save us from Death and Sin.

Lent

- Lent is a time when we share in Jesus' journey in the desert.
- A period where we prepare ourselves for Easter: the Resurrection of Jesus and the renewal of our Baptism and Baptismal Vows.
- We practice Prayer, Fasting and Alms Giving during Lent.

Lent

- We work hard to do three main activities:
 - Prayer – Communicating with God and offering intercessions for people.
 - Fasting – giving something up, like giving up snacks or soda.
 - Alms giving – Giving our time or treasure to those in need.

Ash Wednesday

- We go to Church and receive Ashes on our foreheads in the shape of a cross.
- When they are put on the follow in said “Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.”
- The ashes are a sign that we acknowledge our sinfulness and want to repent.

Holy Week

- This is as Jesus enters Jerusalem, it includes:
 - The people waving palms in honor of Jesus
 - The Last Supper, which is the Passover Feasts the Jewish people celebrated.
 - Jesus' Betrayal
 - Jesus' Trial
 - Jesus' Crucifixion and Burial

Triduum

- It means “Three Days” (TRI DU UM)
- It includes the last days of Holy Week. It begins on Holy Thursday and concludes on Easter Sunday.
- It celebrates Jesus' sacrifice and His triumph over death.

Passion Narrative
