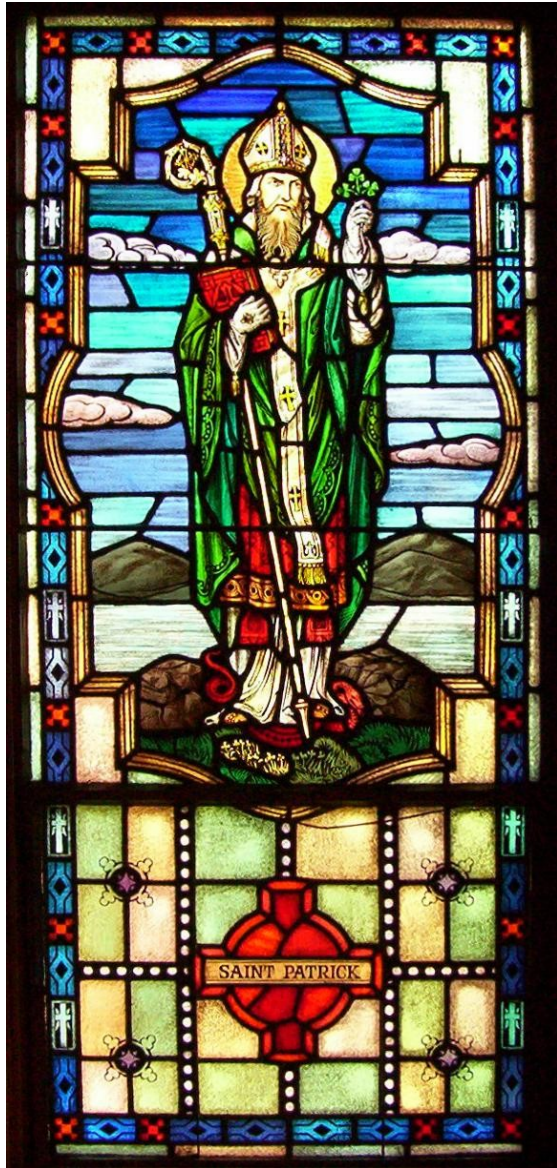

St. Patrick's Day



- Lived from about 390-460
- He was kidnapped from England and brought to Ireland at 16.
- He prayed for six years and found a way to escape back to England.
- He studied to be a priest and then was sent to Ireland by the Pope to evangelize Ireland.
- He used the shamrock to teach the Trinity.

The Raising of Lazarus

- This Gospel is read the week before Palm Sunday.
- This is a sign that Jesus could raise someone from the dead.
- We can apply it to our lives it that we need to trust Jesus and say “Roll away the Stone” to the obstacles that prevent us from going to Jesus.
- It is important to say that Lazarus came back to life as he was before, but when Jesus rises from the Dead on Easter Sunday it is a Glorified Resurrection.

Palm Sunday

- This is the day Jesus Enters Jerusalem and everyone is waving Palms and singing “Hosanna” which means “O Lord, Grant Salvation.”
- This comes from Psalm 118:25-26.
- The Gospel was the Arrest, Trial, Sentencing and Punishment of Jesus

Holy Week

- This is as Jesus enters Jerusalem, it includes:
 - The people waving palms in honor of Jesus
 - The Last Supper, which is the Passover Feasts the Jewish people celebrated.
 - Jesus' Betrayal
 - Jesus' Trial
 - Jesus' Crucifixion and Burial

Holy Week

- The week from Palm Sunday to the Easter Vigil
- **Triduum** - These are the holiest days of the year because Christ's atonement for our sins.
- **Holy Thursday Evening** - The Last Supper - The sacraments of Eucharist and Holy Orders are started. Jesus prays in Gethsemane and is later arrested. The priests on this day receive the holy oils for baptism, confirmation, and anointing of the sick. They are stored in the ambry, right next to our baptismal font.
- **Good Friday** - Christ sentenced and put to death on the Cross. No mass is celebrated, although you can receive communion.
- **Holy Saturday** - Jesus is in the tomb
- **Easter Sunday** - Jesus is raised to life and exits the tomb. He conquers death and shows us that he goes ahead of us in all things, even death.

Passover

- This is the Jewish Celebration that brought Jesus to Jerusalem.
- The Passover was the last of the 10 plagues when the Jewish people were in Egypt

The story of Easter is tied to the story of the Passover.

The Exodus story in the Old Testament has significant meaning for us as Catholics today.

Passover Symbols	Easter Symbols
Passing through the waters of the Red Sea	Baptism (Romans 6:1-4)
Lamb at the Passover	Jesus is the sacrificial lamb that atones us with God
Lamb's blood on the door posts	Jesus' blood on the Cross
Freed from Slavery to Egyptians	Freed from Slavery to Sin
Unleavened Bread (Passover Meal)	Jesus Body and Blood in the Eucharist (Last Supper)

Triduum

- It means “Three Days” (TRI DU UM)
- It includes the last days of Holy Week. It begins on Holy Thursday and concludes on Easter Sunday.
- It celebrates Jesus' sacrifice and His triumph over death.
