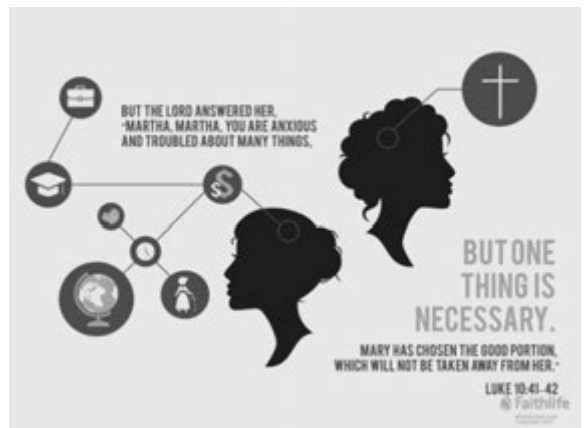
**Background on the Gospel Reading**

Luke 10:38-42



The story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary complements the story of the Good Samaritan, which immediately precedes it in Luke's Gospel. Both stories are unique to Luke. The story of the Samaritan opens with the words "a certain man." Today's reading opens with the words "a certain woman." The Samaritan is an example of how a disciple should see and act. Mary is an example of how a disciple should listen. Mary, a woman, is a marginalized person in society, like the Samaritan. Both do what is not expected of them. As a woman, Mary would be expected, like Martha, to prepare hospitality for a guest. Here again Jesus breaks with the social conventions of his time. Just as a Samaritan would not be a model for neighborliness, so a woman would not sit with the men around the feet of a teacher.

Both stories exemplify how a disciple is to fulfill the dual command which begins chapter 10—love of God (Mary) and love of neighbor (the Samaritan). These are the two essentials of life in the kingdom. By using the examples of a Samaritan and a woman, however, Jesus is saying something more. Social codes and boundaries were strict in Jesus' time. Yet to love God with all one's heart and one's neighbor requires breaking those rules. The Kingdom of God is a society without distinctions and boundaries between its members. It is a society that requires times for seeing and doing and also times for listening and learning at the feet of a teacher.

### **Travelling with kids:** Flying and your child's ears

These tips can help equalize the air pressure in your child's ears and prevent or decrease ear pain during air travel. Have your child:

- **Drink plenty of non-caffeinated fluids** (water is best) throughout the flight. Drinking a lot is very important. It encourages swallowing, which opens the Eustachian tubes. Also, airplane air is dry, which thickens nasal mucus, making it more likely for the Eustachian tubes to become clogged.
- **Take acetaminophen or ibuprofen** about a half hour before takeoffs or landings if you know your child has ear pain when flying.
- **Chew gum or suck on hard candy** (only if your child is over 3 years old).
- **Take a bottle or pacifier or breastfeed.** If you bottle-feed, make sure your baby is sitting upright while drinking.
- **Yawn frequently.**
- **Stay awake for takeoff and landing.** During sleep, we don't swallow as often, so it's harder to keep the air pressure in the middle ear equalized.
- **Practice a breathing exercise.** Older kids and teens can practice this exercise during a flight's ascent and descent: Breathe in slowly, then gently pinch the tip of the nose and exhale through the nose while closing the mouth. Repeat as necessary.

If your child takes medicines containing antihistamine or decongestants, talk to your doctor about whether to continue them during the flight. In some cases, a child may continue to have ear pain for longer periods (up to several hours) if the ears don't "pop" you can continue to give your child pain relievers according to the package directions until the pain eases. If it continues for more than several hours, call your doctor for advice. With a little patience and some simple precautions, though, you can make your next family flight less stressful and more comfortable for both you and your child.

### **Rules for the Car**

- **A seatbelt must be worn during every car trip.**
- **Sit in the back seat.** Kids under 13 years old should always ride in the back seat. This protects them from possible injury
- **Play it cool.** Kids should understand the importance of staying calm and low-key in the back seat.
- **Follow the rules in every car.** Kids need to follow the rules if they are in a friend's or relative's car.

**Did you know?**

**Registration**

If you are presently not on our mailing list, receiving envelopes and the various parish mailings, the chances are that you are not a registered member of our parish. You are not automatically a registered member because you were married here or even if you were brought up here and lived in the parish with your parents—or went to school here. Membership is by formal registration only. Just call the Parish Center at (973) 338-9190 and let us know that you wish to register and the registration form will be mailed to you. Thank you.

**How Do I Arrange a Wedding?**

Archdiocesan policy requires that arrangements be made with a Parish Priest or Deacon at least one year before the wedding date. Arrangements can be made by calling the Parish Center, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. You should be a registered parishioner of St. Thomas in order to be married here.

"Time of Marriage"

Well in advance of making other arrangements for your wedding, the time of your marriage should be arranged with one of the Parish Priests or Deacons.

'Directives'

You should consult one of the parish priests concerning the current Church law when a Catholic is marrying a person of another faith. All procedures for Marriage Preparation must still be followed,

In preparation for Marriage here at Saint Thomas, you would ask you to be willing to follow the norms set by Canon (Church) Law, Archdiocesan and Parish Policy.

**Baptisms**

We remind you to contact the parish at least three months prior to the Baptism of your child.

We have scheduled various dates for Baptisms during the 2019 year. All Baptisms are on Sundays at 1:30pm on the following dates; 7/21, 8/18, 9/22, 10/20, 11/17, 12/15

Baptism is a community celebration. Individual Baptisms are normally performed only in case of necessity.

## Turning to God in Times of Tragedy

Times of disaster or great sadness are trying for us all. Yet these times present opportunities to teach your children lasting spiritual lessons and the importance of trusting God.

**Faith Themes** - Jesus calls us to eternal life with our Father in heaven. The church recognizes corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

### Natural Teachable Moments

- After the sudden death of a friend or family member
- When a natural disaster strikes a community or another country, leaving pain, destruction, famine, disease, orphans, or homelessness
- When political oppression, social injustice, or genocide create a refugee crisis

In the days after September 11, 2001, churches, synagogues, and mosques were filled with people. Around the world candles were lit. Impromptu shrines were filled with flowers and prayer intentions. Prayers were offered for the dead and their suffering families. In tragic times our children naturally have questions about God and heaven. Treat their questions with respect. Be patient, knowing that you do not have all the answers. Pray with your children for all those caught up in tragedy.

**Starting the Conversation** - Think of concrete ways that you, as a family, can be a source of help and comfort for those who suffer, especially those faced with tragic situations.

**To Help You Connect** - One practical and easy first step after a tragedy has struck a community, group, or country—the earthquake in Haiti, the floods in New Orleans, the famines in Africa, or the tsunami in Asia—is to check the website of organizations such as Catholic Charities, the Campaign for Human Development, Red Cross, Jesuit Refugee Service, and Catholic Relief Services. Or perhaps you can get on their mailing list beforehand. These organizations often distribute information about various ways people can immediately help after a disaster. Also, check with your local parish to see what it might be organizing. Then help your child to appreciate the many good things that people of faith are doing in the world.

### *Family Connection for today's Gospel Reading*

Luke 10:38-42

*Jesus visits the house of Martha and Mary.*



In our families and homes, we have boundaries. Some are geographical; we may have our own room or part of a room that we want others to stay out of. Parents may have home offices that are off-limits to children. Some boundaries are behavioral; children may speak one way to their friends, but they are not allowed to speak the same way to their parents or other adults. A Curfew is another type of boundary, whose purpose is to protect children's safety. Talk about examples of boundaries in your family. For the most part, these boundaries are good. Talk about how sometimes we set up boundaries for the wrong reasons. For example, if we are angry with a sibling, we may draw a line and tell him or her to stay on his or her side. Explain that when we use boundaries to exclude others, we are being hurtful. Point out how in Jesus' time, some boundaries were used to unfairly exclude people. One example was from last week's Gospel: Samaritans. This Sunday's Gospel has another example: women. Talk about how the role of women has changed in your lifetime. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus breaks down a barrier that kept women from being disciples.

Read aloud Luke 10:38-42. Talk about how Martha is conditioned by the existing boundaries of her society, but how her sister, Mary, breaks through that boundary and becomes a disciple of Jesus. Talk about how you can work as a family to break down boundaries that separate people. Point out that when we pray the Lord's Prayer, we call God "Our Father," meaning that we are all his children; no boundaries should separate us. Conclude this time together by praying the Lord's Prayer.
