Gospel Reading - Matthew 5:13-16

Jesus teaches that his disciples are to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world.



Following upon the teaching of the Beatitudes, Jesus uses the now familiar metaphors of salt and light to describe the life of discipleship. We take salt and light for granted in our society, but these commodities were more precious in ancient cultures. Just as now, salt was used in Jesus' time for flavoring, as a preservative, and as a healing agent. Similarly, the widespread use of electricity in the modern world makes us less aware of the value and importance of light in our lives.

Still, our familiarity with this passage from Matthew's Gospel speaks well to the abiding power of the imagery that Jesus presented. Jesus' call to be salt for the earth and light for the world powerfully states our mission as Church and as Christians. Our commitment to social justice flows from the exhortation that Jesus gives us in today's Gospel. Some of the activities that this commitment leads us to are given more concrete expression as the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. When we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, console those who mourn, and so on, we show ourselves to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. When we do these things with the community of faith, the Church, we are indeed acting as "a city set on a mountain" that cannot be hidden!

From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Parish Family,

As you know each month we have Hospitality Sunday from 8 am to 12 noon in our parish. This tradition helps us enjoy the company of other members of our parish family and to meet and make new friends. We are also given the opportunity to have our blood pressure checked.

Each month different ministries host the hospitality by providing food and coffee for us to enjoy.

I take this opportunity to thank Bernadette for overseeing our Hospitality Sundays. I thank all of the ministries who so generously provide their hospitality with food, coffee, etc. A BIG thank you to Loida and the Wellness Committee for providing the blood pressure screening each month!

If you haven't come to Hospitality Sunday I invite and encourage you to do so!

Each month I get asked if the rear side doors of the church can be unlocked so everyone can have access to go down to the Parish Center instead of having to go outside and come in through the main entrance.

As you know we have our Liturgy of the Word for Children at the 10:30 Mass. During that time the young people at Mass are brought downstairs to hear the Scripture readings proclaimed and explained in a way that they can better understand. This is a great ministry here in our parish and I thank Fran and all of the catechists for all their hard work, support, and dedication in making this possible.

This brings me to why I do not keep the rear side doors leading down to the PC unlocked. I take very seriously the responsibility I have insuring that our young people gather in a safe environment. Our parents need to be assured that when they place their children in our care that they are cared for and protected. Thus, I can't keep the rear side doors unlocked as long as our young people will be gathering or are gathering in our PC. Once the children are brought back to the church and reunited with their parents the rear side doors of the church will be unlocked allowing the people at the 10:30 Mass to go down to the PC for hospitality after Mass.

I regret the inconvenience that some are experiencing but I think we can agree that the safety of the youngest members of our parish family is our #1 priority.

Next weekend is Hospitality Sunday. Please come down to the Parish Center from 8am to 12pm and enjoy some food and good company.

**FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION
AND TAX ASSISTANCE**

The Holy Name Society continues to provide free federal and state income tax preparation and assistance for seniors and disabled members of St. Thomas the apostle parish. To be eligible for this service, you must be a registered member of St. Thomas, at least 62 years of age or disabled, not actively employed and require no more forms and schedules than those listed below.

Income tax returns will be prepared by experienced tax preparers volunteering their time and talent in the spirit of stewardship.

Income tax returns will be limited to the following forms and schedules: (no business or individual rental forms)

- Federal forms 1040 and 1040sr (for seniors)
- Federal schedules: a,b,d,r,1,2,3,4 and 5
- NJ state form 1040nj
- NJ schedule b
- NJ forms ptr 1 and ptr 2 (senior property tax freeze)

The tax preparation process for each individual or married couple will include an interview, review of your 2018 return and turnover of your tax related documents. Completed returns will be available in about one week.

Tax preparers will be available in the parish center every Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon beginning February 7, 2020 through April 3, 2020.

The tax team has been keeping up with the changes included in the new tax laws beginning with 2018 income tax filing. We would be happy to discuss any federal and/or state tax concerns you may have to assist you in your personal preparation.

Christ in the Eucharist

Part Nine

Catholic vs Protestant Eucharistic Teaching

Last week we spoke about the Catholic teaching on transubstantiation. Transubstantiation is the conversion of the substance of the Eucharistic elements, the bread and wine, into the body and blood of Christ at the consecration of the Mass, so that only the appearances of bread and wine remain but the very nature of those elements has changed.

The substance, which makes bread truly bread, changes, while the appearance of the bread, the accidents, remain unchanged. So transubstantiation means that Christ in his fullness, body, blood, soul, and divinity, is truly present while only the appearance of bread and wine remain.

While the appearance of bread and wine remain for us to indicate the heavenly spiritual food we receive, it is not symbolic of Christ's presence. Christ truly is present. This belief is shared with Eastern Rite Catholic, Eastern Orthodox and Greek Orthodox Churches.

Some people mistakenly believe that some Protestant Churches, such as the Lutherans and Episcopalians, also believe in the Eucharist in the same way as Catholics. This is not true. While some churches claim to believe in a real presence, their understanding of the Eucharist is different than Catholics. While Catholics believe that the substance of the bread and wine change, Lutherans and Episcopalians believe that the substance of the bread and wine remain along with the substance of Christ. This is called Consubstantiation. This was condemned as a heresy first at a council in Rome in 1050 and later at the Fourth Lateran Council in 1215 and finally at the Council of Trent in 1551 in response to Luther.

But the difference grows further. Following Martin Luther's thought, Lutherans today believe that the presence of Christ remains only during the celebration of Holy Communion. Therefore, they do not reserve the sacrament in a tabernacle or bring the Eucharist to the sick at home or in hospitals.

John Calvin rejected both Transubstantiation and Consubstantiation. He denied that Christ was truly present, but that Christ's power was present in the elements and was conferred upon the worshipping community by Christ in heaven.

Another Protestant reformer, Ulrich Zwingli, denied any presence of Christ. The bread and wine were simply symbols of the body and blood of Christ. His thought was that Holy Communion is a mere memorial meal commemorating our redemption through Christ and a confession of faith in Christ by the community.

So we see that the teaching of the Eucharist has been consistent for 2000 years in the Catholic Church, but from the time of the Protestant Reformation on to our present day, many theories have arisen, and with each successive theory the belief in the real presence of Christ diminished until there was no belief in the real presence of Christ at all.

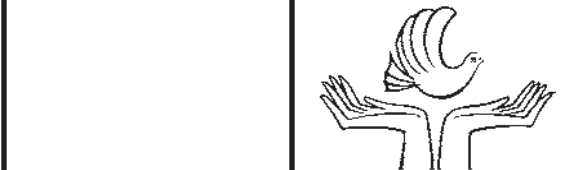
